

■ Volunteer crew members have formed three teams, each tackling a different section of the Lacey Lady. The Wing One Crew has taken on the inboard portion of the number one wing. It has taken more than a year to disassemble this massive 7,000-pound section. Thousands of parts have been removed and even more rivets have been drilled. Once completed, we will start non-destructive testing and mapping of the spar structure in the hope of saving time and expense.

From the Executive Director

When we formed the B-17 Alliance Foundation in 2006, our goal of restoring the B-17 *Lacey Lady* seemed so far off as to be almost a dream. Thanks to an outpouring of volunteer efforts and community support, I am pleased to report that our dream is not only becoming a reality, it has grown beyond our expectations.

The Alliance opened an all-new restoration and exhibition facility at McNary Field in June 2015. This milestone capped more than nine years of fundraising and public outreach to restore the nose section and move the *Lacey Lady* from her precarious perch above a Milwaukie gas station to a permanent, climate-controlled hangar where restoration efforts could continue. Those efforts alone cost more than \$500,000, which would not have been possible without the help of people like you.

Since the move to our new facility, our volunteer workforce has blossomed from 10 to more than 120. These "crew members" bring a wealth of talent and expertise to this project. Engineers, machinists, restoration specialists, and craftsmen have generously given their time to breathe life back into the *Lacey Lady*.

While the *Lacey Lady* is the most visible aspect of our work, our most important mission is about **people**: the 16 million Americans who fought World War II and went on to build the country we enjoy today. Sadly, their legacy is disappearing quickly. Fewer than 700,000 World War II veterans are still alive; 400 die each day. In 20 years, there will be no one left to tell their stories.

"People" are the impetus behind the Alliance's new museum at McNary Field, which — with the help of volunteer docents — is now open three days a week. We have spent years collecting hundreds of war-era memorabilia for display: magazines, photos, newspapers, posters, maps, books, and uniforms. We also have dozens of videotaped interviews with pilots and crews that tell the story of the war through the eyes of the people who lived it.

As far as we have come, there is so much more to do. We invite you to look through this, our first annual report, and celebrate our successes. More than that, we want you to find a place to belong. Our vision is ambitious and we need your help to make it happen.

Thank you for helping us preserve the American spirit.

From the CEO

In December 2015, the B-17 Alliance Foundation successfully removed one of the last remaining B-17 bombers from its perch atop a gas station in Milwaukie, Oregon and moved it to its new home. The move was made possible through more than a decade of fundraising and volunteer effort.



The story of the Lacey Lady, like the war she fought in, is replete with episodes of drama, narrow escapes, bravery, and even humor. My grandfather, Art Lacey, rescued it from a military scrap yard in Oklahoma and somehow managed to fly it to Oregon in 1946. Family lore suggests he did it for two reasons. First, he thought a bomber would make a great — if not eyebrow-raising — canopy for his gas station. Second, a friend bet him it couldn't be done. Suffice it say, my grandfather raised more than a few eyebrows and his friend lost the bet.

As a canopy, the plane did its job admirably. But after more than 60 years of harsh Oregon winters and assaults from birds and vandals, the Lacey Lady was



exhausted. One could almost hear her sigh of relief as she was dismantled and taken to a restoration hangar at Salem's McNary Field.

Restoring a 70-year-old plane to airworthy condition creates a unique set of challenges. There simply are no replacement parts available for a B-17 bomber. Engineers, mechanics, and machinists — working from Boeing's original blueprints — have had to reconstruct many of the parts needed for this project. Thanks to their time and effort — much of which was donated — we have successfully restored the *Lacey Lady's* nose section, which is now undergoing rigorous inspection to ensure it will be airworthy.

While restoring the nose section has filled our crew with a welcome sense of accomplishment, it has also reminded us of how much more there is to do. The B-17 is a massive aircraft. Its wingspan is more than 100 feet; its length exceeds 70 feet. The wing area

alone is more than 1400 square feet. Before the Lacey Lady can be declared airworthy, every square inch must be disassembled, carefully inspected, and then repaired or restored to precise specifications. There is no room for error.

Fortunately, the community has welcomed the *Lacey Lady* with open arms. Crew members donated more than 9000 hours last year, doing everything from remodeling the hangar to creating massive steel structures that will hold sections of the plane as they undergo restoration. Volunteer crew members have formed three teams, each tackling a different section of the plane. Other volunteers have created museum-quality displays and served as docents. Whatever your skill set, we need your help.

Reaching Out to Veterans

How do you honor veterans? What makes them feel special? These are questions we ask ourselves each month as we prepare for the B-17 Alliance Veterans Coffee Club.

The B-17 Alliance Foundation is not just about the plane, it's about *people*. For 15 years, our Coffee Club has provided free coffee and conversation for veterans and those who wish to honor them. The Coffee Club meets the third Thursday of each month in the Lacey Lady's restoration hangar at McNary Field. About 50 people attended these coffees each month during 2018-2019, double the attendance of the previous year.

Participation in the Coffee Club is on a "come-asyou-wish" basis. There are no commitments, no dues, and no charge. Members gather to share



their personal stories and military memories. These stories inspire conversation and help these men and women realize that they are not alone, that there are many who care about the sacrifices they made. The atmosphere of mutual honor and respect is priceless.

In August of 2018, the Coffee Club partnered with Quilts of Valor to recognize four veterans of World War II. Handcrafted quilts were draped around each veteran to honor their service. The distinctive quilts





are meant to warm the heart, provide comfort, and help heal wounds that are perhaps unseen. The ceremony also drove home the reason why we are an



"Alliance": we are working every day to build partnerships with like-minded groups.

The August 2018 meeting also created an especially poignant moment when member Tom Korn offered his handmade quilts to other members. Tom



has been a support and inspiration to the Foundation since its move to Salem. He understands that our mission is much more than restoration of a rare aircraft; it is about recognizing and celebrating the dignity of what has rightfully been described as "The Greatest Generation."

Financials

Thanks to an outpouring of community support and some internal restructuring efforts, the B-17 Alliance Foundation has experienced exceptional growth in recent years.

Organizational structure

The Foundation was formed in 2006 and is classified as a tax-exempt, nonprofit organization under the *Internal Revenue Code*. Our EIN number is 20-3507294. In 2016, our financial reporting year was changed from a calendar year to a fiscal year ending on July 31.

Net income and total assets

We are pleased to report that gross profit increased nearly 35 percent in FY 2018-19 over the previous fiscal year. Net income increased to \$28,009 in FY 2018-19 compared to a net loss of \$13,576 in FY 2017-18. Through careful stewardship of funds, total Foundation assets have also increased almost threefold over the past six reporting periods, starting with \$83,683 in CY 2013 and ending with \$235,716 in FY 2018-19.



*The Foundation switched from a calendar year to a fiscal year reporting period in 2016.

In FY 2018-19, the Foundation received more than 81 percent of its income from contributed support and in-kind donations of





Terry Scott, Executive Director



Dr. Larry Bentley, Director




Lawrence Martin, Director


